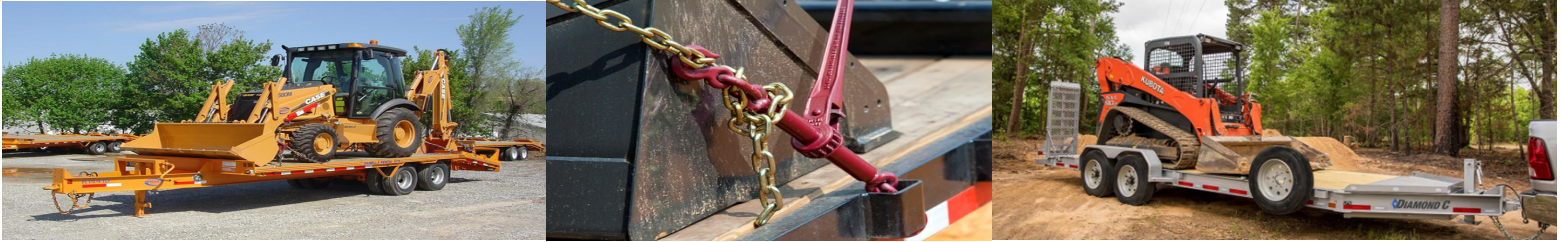

RISK REMINDER

Loading Equipment on Trailers



When loading equipment onto trailers, always remember:

- 1. Inspect Equipment and Trailer:**
 - a. Ensure both the equipment and trailer are in good working condition.
 - b. Check for any visible damage or wear that could compromise safety.
- 2. Use Proper Loading Techniques:**
 - a. Use proper ramps or loading docks for the size/type of equipment.
 - b. Securely fasten ramps to prevent slipping or shifting during loading.
- 3. Balance the Load:**
 - a. Distribute the weight evenly across the trailer to avoid tipping or swaying.
 - b. Position the heaviest part of the equipment over the trailer axles.
- 4. Secure the Load:**
 - a. Use appropriate tie-downs, chains, and binders to secure the equipment.
 - b. Double-check all connections to ensure they are tight and secure.
- 5. Follow Weight Limits:**
 - a. Do not exceed the trailer's weight capacity.
 - b. Calculate the combined weight to avoid overloads.
- 6. Wear Protective Gear:**
 - a. Always wear appropriate personal protective equipment (PPE) such as gloves, helmets, and steel-toed boots.
- 7. Stay Alert:**
 - a. Be aware of your surroundings and watch for any potential hazards.
 - b. Communicate clearly with team members to coordinate movements.
